



ORTHODONTIC TOPIC: HOW TO USE WAX FOR BRACES

Braces are a fact of life, and while occasionally uncomfortable, will ultimately help you get the smile you deserve. But sometimes, you may experience a pokey sensation that may be uncomfortable due to wires pressing against your gums. That's where dental wax comes in, a special wax you can have on hand that will provide relief and prevents pain. Here's a look at what orthodontic wax is, how to put it on, and how it can ease your braces discomfort. What's important to note is that orthodontic wax is natural and safe to have in your mouth.

How Does Dental Wax Work?

The unique properties of dental wax make it perfect for protecting your gums from the metal edges of braces. The wax is solid at room temperature but can be softened and shaped by the warmth of your hands. When smoothed onto the braces that irritate, it sticks to them and creates a buffer between the brackets and the gums. Dental wax remains smooth while in the mouth and harmlessly flakes



How to use wax: A.K.A how to get it to stick

@braces 101

- 1. Dry the area irritating you using a Cotton ball/tissue.
- 2. Pull off a generous amount of wax and roll it into a ball with your fingers.
- 3. Stick it onto the wire/bracket that's bothering you. Make sure this entire time the area stayed dry!









away or peels off as it breaks down.

How to Put Wax On Braces

Whether you're protecting your gums from new braces or sticking down a piece of protruding wire, the procedure for applying dental wax is

Wash your hands

the same:

- Brush all of your teeth
- Pinch off a piece of wax about the size of a small pea
- Squeeze until it softens and roll it into a ball, then flatten the ball slightly
- Dry excess saliva off of area by using a Q-tip or tissue (this is an essential step to make sure the wax sticks)
- Gently push the wax onto the problem area of the braces. You can also use your tongue to adjust the wax if it's helpful.

Keep in mind, if your wire continues to protrude or become out of place, contact us so that we can adjust it. If you run out of dental wax, you can get more wax at our office or even buy more at a pharmacy.

As far as how long dental wax should stay in place, you can wear it overnight and replace the wax as needed, though you should replace it every two days. While you can eat and drink with wax, you should remove it if food becomes stuck or the wax gets dirty.

Dental wax is safe, natural, and helpful during those unpleasant times when wires become loose or you experience irritation, and can make your braces experience less uncomfortable. If you need assistance applying dental wax, we would be happy to show you how. Otherwise, know that you have a simple tool on hand that can improve your braces experience.
