

ORTHODONTIC TOPIC: THE SAFETY OF DIGITAL X-RAYS

Sometimes parents are concerned about having x-rays taken of themselves or their children, especially if they already had them taken at another office. Our office prefers to take our own x-rays to ensure accurate diagnosis. The amount of radiation received from xray is extremely minimal, and we would like to take this opportunity to provide you data so you can hopefully understand how minimal it is. A Microsievert is the measurement of the dosage of radiation that is absorbed into our bodies. The average person receives approximately 2,400 Microsieverts of

radiation per year. We receive the majority of this radiation from radon gas that is emitted from the Earth's surface. Other sources of radiation include exposure to sunlight, food, drinking water, natural gas, cell phones, and soil. Our office takes a panoramic radiograph, which omits 8 Microsieverts, as well as a Cephalometric radiograph, which omits 20 Microsieverts. So, in summary, the amount of radiation received from these x-rays taken in our office is ONE PERCENT (1%) of the 2, 400 Microsieverts you or your child are receiving this year.
